❖ The TFAS Summer Law Fellowship in Washington D.C. is an intensive 9-week program that exposes law students to issues of constitutional interpretation, limited government and free enterprise through legal internships, academic coursework, networking events, and career development sessions. In addition, students attend a law and public policy lecture series with leading constitutional scholars, judges, and practicing attorneys. Those selected to participate in the fellowship program will receive a full-tuition scholarship to attend the program and housing for the duration of the program. Awards are highly selective – only 15-20 students will be invited to participate in the 2019 program. Competitive candidates should have a strong academic record, demonstrated interest in the principles of originalism, limited government, and free enterprise, and a commitment to honorable leadership and the values essential to the preservation and success of a free society. □

Additionally, the view is that one learns mathematics by doing mathematics-- by working on, tackling, and solving interesting and challenging problems. The SUMaC program gives participants a variety of problems at different levels of abstraction, starting with problems that are relatively concrete and to some extent familiar. ❖ HS (11<sup>th</sup> grade) - **Summer College Engineering Exposure Program (SCEEP)**- SCEEP is designed to familiarize student with various engineering disciplines offered at UM and to acquaint them with the university campus, support services, and other resources. Thirty students are invited to take part in each session offered and those participants attend four classes, (Technical Communications, Engineering Concepts, Engineering Math, and Professional Development) which are designed to develop their understanding of engineering, its disciplines and the process to follow when applying for Engineering School. The students work on a team multidisciplinary engineering design project and their college portfolio within those classes, however, their experience is enhanced by guided tours of the engineering departments and facilities alongside presentations given by university departments on the admissions process and how to finance their education and fireside chats given by College of Engineering Alumni, Faculty and students. Some of the participants are given the opportunity to take part in an ACT Prep course.
